Scope of Study

Summary: Election data for 50 states and the District of Columbia were collected through interviews conducted with voters as they left their polling places on election day, November 7, 2004. The Oregon election data were collected solely through pre-election telephone interviews because voting in that state was conducted entirely by mail. Part 1, Combined Data, is an aggregate of all of the other datasets in this collection. Part 2, National Data, contains data collected from a national sample. National sample respondents were asked a series of questions about their electoral choices, the issues surrounding the elections, and the factors that influenced their decisions. Questions focused on the direction of the country, national security, terrorism, the war in Iraq, the state and future of the nation's economy, gay marriage, and the George W. Bush presidency. Background information on national respondents includes age, race, gender, Hispanic descent, sexual orientation, age of children in household, marital status, political party, political orientation, employment status, education, religion, and family income. Parts 3-53 contain data collected from the individual state and District of Columbia surveys. Telephone surveys were conducted with absentee/early voters in Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Iowa, Michigan, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, Oregon, Tennessee, Texas, and Washington State. Respondents were asked for their opinions of President George Bush, presidential candidate John Kerry, and the United States Congress, as well as for their vote choices in the relevant gubernatorial, senatorial, and congressional elections. Those queried were also asked whether they supported state-specific proposals, such as state funding of stem-cell research in California and defining marriage only as a union between a man and a

woman in several states. Background information on individual state respondents includes age, race, gender, education, voter participation history, political party, political orientation, and family income.

Data Collection Notes: Respondent weights are included with each data file. These values can be found under the variable name WGT in all of the data files in this collection, with the exception of the combined data, where this value can be found under the variable name XSWG. These weights should be applied in all analyses. Unweighted tabulations will be seriously misleading and should not be used.

Methodology

Sample: The statewide samples were selected in two stages. First, a probability sample of voting precincts within each state was selected that represented the different geographic areas across the state and the vote by party. Second, within each precinct, voters were sampled systematically throughout the voting day at a rate that gave all voters in a precinct the same chance of being interviewed. The national sample is a subsample of the statewide sample precincts. Pre-election telephone interviews were conducted in 12 states with large populations of absentee and early voters and in Oregon, where voting is conducted entirely by mail. The samples for the telephone interviews were selected using random-digit dialing (RDD) in these 12 states.

Absentee or early voters were asked the same questions asked at the polling place on election day. On election day, the results from the absentee/early voter telephone surveys were combined with the data from the exit polls so as to ensure that those two groups were represented in the data in the same proportion as in the actual vote totals. The Oregon sample was a dual frame design using both registration lists and RDD sampling. An RDD sample of Oregon telephone numbers was selected. Any telephone number already on the registration list was eliminated from the RDD sample. The result was a dual frame design that represented every voter in the state of Oregon with a land-line telephone only once. Individuals were selected by name from the registration list. This part of the sample was 622 interviews, while 280 interviews were completed from the RDD portion. Each RDD residential number represented a household. One individual was selected at random within each RDD household. The relative size of these two groups are estimated from the registration list.

Documentation for the
2004 General Election Exit Polls

I. Introduction

The National Election Pool (ABC News, Associated Press, CBS News, CNN, Fox News and NBC News) sponsored exit polls for the 2004 General Elections. The questionnaires were solely the work of the NEP. Edison/Mitofsky designed and conducted the exit polls for NEP. This document describes the exit poll datasets, explains how to access the data and how to interpret the column location documentation. It also includes information regarding the analysis of these data.

Attached are the following: a description of the “National Election Pool Exit Poll Methodology,” a list of state numbers and region codes, detailed column location information for each dataset, a map of the geostrata used in each state and the exit poll questionnaires in .PDF format.

II. Data Files

Fifty-three data files are available – the national survey dataset, one dataset for each state plus the District of Columbia, and a combined data file. The data are made available as ascii files and in SPSS format. Within each state’s directory, you will find:

- a) a folder containing the ascii file (ending in .DAT)
- b) column definitions (a text document) for that state
- c) an SPSS folder containing datafiles (ending in .SAV) and portable files (ending in .POR)
- d) a folder containing the questionnaire and geostrata map for that state in .PDF format.

The combined data file contains responses from all respondents surveyed by the NEP on election day or during a pre-election absentee voter survey for the 11 questions that were asked on every questionnaire and the additional variables described in section III.e below. Questions common to all 51 surveys include presidential vote, sex, race, age, party identification, political ideology, religion, income, time of decision on presidential vote, vote for your candidate/against his opponent, presidential job approval, Iraq war approval and family’s financial situation compared to four years ago.

In order to create a nationwide file out of fifty-one separate surveys, an additional adjustment has been made to the state-level weights based on the size of the statewide vote. This adjustment was applied

to the existing weights in the state files. The additional adjustment is applied equally to each respondent in a state and increases or decreases that state's representation in the file based on that state's portion of the national vote.

III. All Surveys

The information in this section applies to the national and all of the state surveys.

a. Weights

Respondent weights are included with each data file. They can be found in columns 18 through 23 of each file. These weights should be applied in all analyses. **Unweighted tabulations will be seriously misleading and should not be used.** In the SPSS data file, these values can be found under the variable label WGT. In the combined data file, this value can be found under the variable label XSWGTT and is located in columns 55 through 60 of the ascii file.

For additional information on weighting, see the methodology statement on page 12.

b. Backside Variable

One key variable, known as the "backside" variable, exists on all surveys that used a two-sided questionnaire. It can be found in column 16 in all applicable states. When BACKSIDE = 1, there was at least one response on the reverse side of the questionnaire, indicating that the respondent turned the questionnaire over. This allows the researcher who is analyzing a question that appears on the backside to omit respondents who did not turn the questionnaire over. For all respondents where BACKSIDE = 2, responses to any question that appeared on page 2 of the questionnaire are coded as system missing in the SPSS file and are blank in the ascii file.

c. Blanks/Omits

A blank represents an omit, or a non-response, to an item. However, a blank can also represent that the respondent was not asked the question.

To make sure that your results match those published by the National Election Pool, the attached files apply the following policies for coding omits:

1. On most demographic variables (such as age), all blanks have been set to a missing code in the SPSS files and appear as blanks in the ascii data.
2. On opinion variables (such as favorable ratings), blanks are treated as "Don't Know" responses and are considered to be valid responses. They have been recoded as the numeral nine ("9") in the SPSS files and in the ascii data.
3. Some questions asked on the exit poll do not apply to or cannot be asked of absentee or early vote respondents. For these questions, absentee respondents have been set to a missing code in the SPSS files and appear as blanks in the ascii data. Affected questions are noted in each datafile's documentation.

Note, however, that different rules apply if the variable called BACKSIDE equals two. If no questions

were answered on the backside, all backside questions have been set to a missing code in the SPSS files and appear as blanks in the ascii data.

d. Language

In eight states, questionnaires in Spanish as well as in English were available in every precinct in which Hispanics represented 20% or more of the total population. Spanish language questionnaires were available in some precincts in Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York and Texas, and additionally in one precinct in Louisiana that was included in the national sample. In the data sets for these eight states and in the national data set, the variable SPANISHQ (column 140) indicates the language of the questionnaire the respondent completed.

e. Additional Items

These items, not on the questionnaire, were added to all data files:

The final two variables – SIZEPLAC and SIZEPLC3 – retain the same coding structure that Voter News Service (VNS) used in previous years, but the codes were assigned using a different procedure. Edison/Mitofsky collected the ZIP code of each precinct in its state and national samples and matched that ZIP code with a data set that showed the position in an MSA (if any) and the population of the city or town that each ZIP code is assigned to. If a precinct falls within the central or principal city of an MSA, SIZEPLAC is coded “1”, “2”, or “4” based on the population. If it falls within an MSA but not in the central or principal city, it is coded “3”, and if it does not fall within an MSA, it is coded “5”.

f. Changes from VNS 2000 variables

The following variables have been changed since the VNS 2000 exit polls:

Income – Two new codes have been added to the income question, making an 8-part response set used in every state. New and revised codes are bolded below:

- 2 - \$15,000 - \$29,999
- 3 - \$30,000 - \$49,999

Religion – Two new codes have been added to the religion question, making an 8-part response set used in every state. New codes are bolded below:

Time of decision – The response set for the question on time of decision on presidential vote is different than in 2000.

VNS 2000:

When did you finally decide who to vote for in the presidential election?

- 2 – In the last week
- 3 – In the last month
- 4 – Before that

NEP 2004:

When did you finally decide for whom to vote in the presidential election?

- 1 – Just today
- 2 – In the last three days

Three other changes to note:

- VOTE2000 (Question V on Version 3 of the National) is worded differently than the 96VOTE question used by VNS in 2000.
- BUSH4, the presidential job approval question, includes four response codes, while VNS used only two codes in 2000.
- QTYPE (col. 13) is the NEP equivalent to VNS's STATE variable, indicating whether a respondent received a national or state questionnaire. A "1" means that the respondent used a state questionnaire, a "2" means the respondent used a national questionnaire. The VNS variable used "1" to indicate a national questionnaire and "2" to indicate a state questionnaire.

g. The Race Question

On all questionnaires, Question B asked respondents to describe their race as White, Black, Hispanic, Asian or other. On all four versions of the national and in states with Hispanic populations of five percent or more, a second question asked whether the respondent was of Hispanic descent. For the 2004 general election, these states were: Arizona, California, Colorado, Connecticut, the District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Kansas, Massachusetts, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Oklahoma, Oregon, Rhode Island, Texas, Utah, Washington and Wyoming. In most of those states the separate question on Hispanic descent is called LATINO, it reads, “Are you of Hispanic or Latino descent?” and uses a yes or no response set. A different question was used in Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, New Mexico and Texas.

In Arizona, California, Colorado and Texas, the question, called MEXICAN, read, “Are you of Mexican or Hispanic descent?” with a yes or no response set.

In Florida, it was called CUBAN3 and read, “Are you of Cuban or Hispanic descent?” This variable includes two codes which indicate that the respondent is of Hispanic descent (1=Yes, Cuban and 2=Yes, other Hispanic). The “No” answer in Florida is code 3, not code 2.

In New Mexico, the question, called SPANISH, read, “Are you of Spanish, Mexican or Hispanic descent?” with a yes or no response set.

Answers from question B and the Hispanic descent question were combined to produce a variable called RACE in the following way:

This recoding was done to better identify Hispanic voters who may have answered “White” or some other race on Question B. In Florida, responses “1” and “2” were coded the same as response “1” to Latino, Mexican or Spanish, and response “3” was treated the same as response “2” to Latino, Mexican or Spanish.

Note that in nine states an additional code was included on Question B. In Arizona, Montana, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota and Wyoming, 5 = American Indian and 6 = Other. In Alaska, 5 = Alaska native and 6 = Other. In Hawaii, 5 = Native Hawaiian and 6 = Other. When creating the RACE variable for these states, response “5” and response “6” were combined into one “Other” category, coded 5.

The original responses to the Race question (question B), called “QRACE” (“QRACEAI” in Arizona, Montana, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota and Wyoming; “QRACEAK” in Alaska; “QRACEHI” in Hawaii) appear elsewhere in the data sets. The results for the variable called “RACE” were reported on Election Day and should generally be used in any analysis of the racial and ethnic background of respondents.

(Note that this corresponds to the policy VNS instituted in the 1998 general election. Findings on Hispanics in the 2004 general election data sets are comparable to those in the 2000 exit polls, but not to the exit polls VNS conducted in 1992 or 1996. For more information, check the documentation that VNS filed with their datasets in 2000.)

IV. National Survey

The information in this section applies only to the national survey.

a. Design

A sample of exit poll precincts was drawn in each state. A subsample of these precincts was selected to form the national sample. Respondents in the national precincts were given one of four versions of the national questionnaire. The four versions were interleaved on pads that were handed out to respondents. Responses to the four versions are combined into one dataset. All versions have questions in common as well as questions unique to each version. Versions 1 and 2 include the same questions, but on version 2 the order of the responses for ISSUE04G and QUAL04G was reversed.

Version numbers were located in two places on the front of each questionnaire, in the header in the upper right corner and in the footer in the bottom right corner. Version numbers are included in the dataset as noted above. To determine which questions are on which version of the questionnaire, simply crosstab each question by “Version” (found in column 14 in the ascii dataset). All questions which do not appear on a particular version are entered as system missing in the SPSS file and are blank in the ascii dataset.

Generic versions of the national questionnaires are included in .PDF form. The national questionnaire used in each state included the appropriate candidates in the statewide races. For the House vote, in states with one, at-large, congressional district or where all the national precincts were in the same congressional district, candidate names were printed on the questionnaire. The at-large states were Alaska, Delaware, Montana and Vermont, and those with only one congressional district in the sample

were Mississippi (CD 4) and Rhode Island (CD 1). In all other states, the House candidates were listed as “The Democratic candidate” and “The Republican candidate.”

b. Breaking news

On version 4 of the national questionnaire, a question was set aside that would allow the National Election Pool to ask about late breaking news events. On the Sunday before the election, interviewers were instructed to write in “the Osama bin Laden video” on the blank line on each version 4 questionnaire that had been sent to them for use on November 2. The question looked like this:

[L] In your vote for president today, how would you rate the importance of

The purpose of this question was to allow the National Election Pool to have an exit poll question about an event that occurred as late as the Sunday before an election, even though the questionnaires had been printed about a week before the election occurred.

In the national SPSS dataset, this variable is labeled “Breaking” and can be found in column 79 of the ascii dataset. This question was not asked of absentee phone poll respondents.

c. Additional Item

This item, not on the questionnaire, was added to the national data file:

d. Absentee/Early Voter Survey

Edison Media Research/Mitofsky International conducted pre-election telephone interviews of 500 people who said they voted by mail using an absentee ballot or voted in-person at an early voting location. Absentee or early voters were asked the same questions asked at the polling place on Election Day.

On election day, the results from the absentee/early voter telephone surveys were combined with the data from the exit polls conducted that day in a way that made sure those two groups were represented in the data in the same proportion as they were in the actual vote totals.

There is a variable in each of these files indicating whether the respondent was interviewed as part of the election day exit poll or the telephone/early exit poll, called TELEPOLL (column 17).

The states where absentee/early voters were interviewed for the National exit poll are: Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Iowa, Michigan, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, Oregon, Tennessee, Texas and Washington state. Absentee voters in these states made up 13% of the total national vote in the 2000 presidential election. Another 3% of the 2000 total vote was cast absentee in other states in 2000 and where there is no absentee/early voter telephone poll.

The Wats Room conducted the fieldwork for the national telephone survey. Households were selected using random-digit dialing, and a respondent was randomly selected within each household. Interviewing began on October 25, 2004 and concluded on October 31, 2004. Before the telephone survey results were combined with the exit poll data they were weighted to reflect the probabilities of selection and to reflect demographic characteristics in that state. The demographic weighting was based on all respondents 18 years of age or older selected in the sample regardless of whether they voted absentee/early or not.

V. State Surveys

The information in this section applies only to the state surveys.

a. Design

As mentioned above, a sample of exit poll precincts was drawn in each state. A subsample of these precincts was selected to form the national sample. The remaining precincts in each state made up the state sample and were given questionnaires specific to that state. Because the national questionnaire has several items in common with the state questionnaire, national respondents are included in the state exit poll dataset for these common questions.

To determine which questions are on the national questionnaire, simply crosstab each question by QTYPE (found in column 13 of the ascii dataset), indicating whether the respondent completed the state or national survey. If the corresponding item did not appear on that respondent's version of the questionnaire, it was coded as system missing in the SPSS file and will appear as a blank in the ascii dataset. Remember, as noted above, some questions on the national survey appear on all four versions of the national and some do not.

b. Additional Item

The following item, not on the questionnaire, was added to all of the state datasets:

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c. Early/Absentee Voter Survey

Edison Media Research/Mitofsky International conducted pre-election telephone interviews of people who said they had either already voted by mail using an absentee ballot or voted in-person at an early voting location. These interviews were conducted in twelve states with large populations of absentee and early voters and in Oregon, where voting is conducted entirely by mail. Absentee or early voters were asked the same questions asked at the polling place on Election Day.

In addition to Oregon, telephone surveys were conducted in Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Iowa, Michigan, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, Tennessee, Texas and Washington. In each state, the survey included voters who had either already voted absentee/early or who were likely to do so. These are the full sample sizes: Arizona N=381, California N=474, Colorado N=477, Florida N=376, Iowa N=345, Michigan N=324, Nevada N=465, New Mexico N=371, North Carolina N=299, Oregon N=951, Tennessee N=333, Texas N=346 and Washington N=676.

On election day, the results from the absentee/early voter telephone surveys were combined with the data from the exit polls conducted that day in a way that made sure those two groups were represented in the data in the same proportion as they were in the actual vote totals.

There is a variable in each of these files indicating whether the respondent was interviewed as part of the election day exit poll or the pre-election telephone poll, called TELEPOLL (column 17).

Universal Survey Center conducted the interviews for the Tennessee, Texas and Washington telephone surveys.

The Wats Room conducted the interviews for the Iowa and Michigan telephone surveys.

On-Line Communications conducted the interviews for the Colorado, Nevada and North Carolina telephone surveys.

Interviewing Services of America conducted the interviews for the Arizona, California, Florida and New Mexico telephone surveys.

Households in all telephone polls except for Oregon were selected using random-digit dialing, and a respondent was randomly selected within each household. Interviewing for the California, Iowa, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Tennessee and Texas surveys began on October 22, 2004 and

concluded on October 31, 2004. Interviewing for the Arizona, Colorado, Florida, Michigan, North Carolina and Washington surveys began on October 25, 2004 and concluded on October 31, 2004.

Before the telephone survey results were combined with the exit poll data they were weighted to reflect the probabilities of selection and to reflect demographic characteristics in that state. The demographic weighting was based on all respondents 18 years of age or older selected in the sample regardless of whether they voted absentee/early or not.

The University of Oregon Survey Center conducted the interviews for the Oregon survey.

The Oregon sample was a dual frame design using both registration lists and RDD sampling. The registration list was obtained from the state as of September 15, 2004. Telephone numbers were successfully matched with the registration list for almost two-thirds of the individuals on the list. Some telephone numbers were added to the list and others were already on the list.

An RDD sample of Oregon telephone numbers was selected. Any telephone number already on the registration list was eliminated from the RDD sample. The result was a dual frame design that represented every voter in the state of Oregon with a land-line telephone only once. Excluded from such a design were non-landline telephone customers that did not have a phone number on the registration list and registered voters without telephones.

Individuals were selected by name from the registration list. This part of the sample was 622 interviews, while 280 interviews were completed from the RDD portion. Each RDD residential number represented a household. One individual was selected at random within each RDD household. The relative size of these two groups are estimated from the registration list.

2004 National Election Pool Exit Poll Methodology

The NEP exit polls were developed and conducted by Edison Media Research and Mitofsky International. NEP is a pool of ABC News, Associated Press, CNN, CBS News, FOX News and NBC News. The exit poll results are based on interviews with a probability sample of voters exiting polling places in each state on Election Day.

The error due to sampling for most state exit poll questions is approximately plus or minus 4 percentage points (see the sampling error table below). This means 95 times out of 100, samples like this one will have results within 4 points of what a complete count of all voters would show. Results based on part of the sample will have larger margins of error, as will groups of voters -- such as Blacks -- who are found disproportionately in some precincts.

Sampling

The samples were selected in two stages. First, a probability sample of voting precincts within each state was selected that represents the different geographic areas across the state and the partisan make-up of the state. Precincts were selected with a probability proportionate to the number of voters in each precinct. There are two exceptions. In some states, precincts that have large minority populations were sampled at a higher rate than other precincts. In New Hampshire a few very large precincts were sampled with certainty. The sample weighting (described below) adjusts the representation of these precincts to their correct share of the total vote. Within each precinct, voters were sampled systematically throughout the voting day at a rate that gives all voters in a precinct the same chance of being interviewed.

Weighting

The exit poll results are weighted to reflect the complexity of the sampling design. That is, the weighting takes into account the different probabilities of selecting a precinct and of selecting a voter within each precinct. For example, minority precincts that were selected at a higher rate receive a smaller weight than other precincts of the same size. There is also an adjustment for voters who were missed or refused to be interviewed, which is based on their observed age, race and gender.

NOTE: The exit poll results are only meaningful if they are weighted. Unweighted tabulations may be seriously misleading and should not be used for any reason.

Questions Altered over the Years

Comparing data from one election year to another should be done carefully. "Trends" are established by comparing questions that are asked in exactly the same way. Failure to exercise appropriate care could lead to invalid conclusions about voting behavior. Please consult VNS documentation about exit polls conducted between 1994 and 2002 before making comparisons between these data and previous exit polls.

Sampling Error

The error due to sampling depends, among other things, on the number of respondents in each group. The sampling errors below are for most voter groups. There are 95 chances in 100 that a sample result is within this many percentage points of the result that would have been obtained by interviewing every voter.

The sampling error also depends on the distribution of a characteristic among precincts. For example, black or high income voters may be found clustered in only a few sample precincts. A characteristic that is clustered in a few precincts has a larger sampling error than characteristics such as sex that are not as highly clustered. Sampling error may be up to three times larger for highly clustered characteristics.

Example: If there are a total of 1,000 respondents in the sample, the sampling error on the 50% of men voting for a candidate depends on the number of men in the poll. In this example, if there are 500 men, the table below shows that if about half vote for a candidate, the sampling error is about plus or minus 6.0 percentage points.

National Election Pool Exit Poll Completion Rates - 2004

The following table contains the respondent completion rates for all of the exit polls conducted by the NEP in 2004 and by VNS in 2000.

This overall completion rate is computed by averaging the completion rates in each precinct weighted by the exit poll sample weight. The precinct completion rate is equal to the number of completed questionnaires divided by the number of attempts (completed questionnaires + total refusals and misses).

For comparison purposes we have recalculated the VNS completion rates from 2000 using this formula. The completion rate for the National Sample Precincts is the weighted average completion rate for the 250 precincts used in the national sample. The completion rate for All Precincts is the average completion rate for all 1,469 precincts used in all of the state samples. The 2004 national completion rate decreased by one half of one percent since 2000. The completion rates increased in 23 states and decreased in 27 states.
